He also has the honor to work with the United Nations on reforms and Human Rights. He has been Vice Chancellor of the University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir Muzaffarabad(Pakistan). At present he is also heading EU Think Tank on CR, HR and diplomacy.

He is honorary chairman of International Human Rights Observer (IHRO) which enjoys Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations and working together with Governments, United Nations and other International institutions to promote and protect the basic fundamental human rights of the masses declared in the universal charter of human rights of United Nations to build a global village of lasting peace, social, and economic justice and development for the 21st century.
